In addition, Fair Labor Association (FLA) issued a progress report on FGV and RSPO published a statement on the issue too. - In November 2020, FGV adopted its revised Group Sustainability Policy (GSP) in which provisions on labour were strengthened based on the FLA Workplace Code of Conduct. - In February and March 2021, the FLA conducted a second validation exercise to assess FGV's progress in implementing its action plan. - FGV had discussions with their US-based legal counsel and has appointed ELEVATE as the independent auditing firm to conduct an assessment of FGV's operations against the 11 ILO Indicators of Forced Labour. - FGV had remediation plan and targeted to submit the remediation plan verification result by Q4 2023. - FGV is implementing Elevate 's recommendations to reimburse its current and former foreign workers, who were employed after 27 June 2019 and had to pay recruitment fees to agents or other third parties in their countries of origin. - On 10 January 2024, FGV announced (https://www.fgvholdings.com/press_release/fgv-makes-significant-strides-in-addressing-us-customs-withhold-release-order-rm72-2-mil-reimbursed-to-workers-strengthened-recruitment-procedures-for-no-recruitment-fee/?pagen=1) that total of RM72.2 million has been reimbursed to 19,673 workers. FGV appointed LRQA, formerly known as ELEVATE to conduct a verification of the reimbursement exercise. LRQA is expected to conduct its follow-up assessment in the first quarter of 2024 which is to verify the implementation of FGV's overall remediation plan. Note that LDC has the following criteria when considering grievances:

- Grievances are considered at a Group level, so grievances carried out at one mill/plantation incur an evaluation to the group as a whole
- For suppliers who are removed from an LDC approved supplier list, this applies to both buy **and** sell physical transactions
- For suppliers removed from an LDC approved supplier applies to all commodities LDC is involved in. There have been several cases where a different LDC product line has ceased trading with a supplier due to the supplier's poor performance in palm.
